RE: Calculations of Graduate Tuition per Budget Model

Dear Deans,

I am writing to provide you with information about the graduate tuition (GRTR) budget model allocations. The graduate budget model distributes the incremental change in tuition revenue such that the 2022-23 allocation is based on the revenue change in 2021-22 compared to 2020-21, after backing out revenue associated with the Master's Enrollment Incentive Program (MEIP). More revenue is available for distribution per the GRTR model this year. As in 2021-22, allocations for 2022-23 are again being made as both current and base.

Tuition Allocations to Deans

The GRTR model distributes 33% of the increased graduate tuition to Deans, based on the lead dean designation for a graduate program. These funds are intended to support investments in graduate education. The incremental increase in the tuition allocation to Deans for 2022-23 is \$646,000 in base funding.

While Deans have discretion in how allocations are used to support graduate education within their school or college, we are also able to identify how a Dean's share is generated by program. BIA will provide each unit with program level detail for unit planning purposes.

Graduate Student Support Allocated through the Office of Graduate Studies

The GRTR budget model distributes 50% of the NRST incremental growth generated by Master's enrollments to Graduate Studies (GS) to be directed to the graduate programs as graduate student support. The amount provided to GS for graduate master's NRST is \$651,000 lower than it was in 2021-22. Graduate aid has increased through the MEIP, however.

Central Campus Share of Tuition and NRST

The GRTR model distributes 67% of the incremental growth in graduate tuition (which includes the return to aid component), 100% of the incremental growth in NRST paid by Ph.D. students, and 50% of the incremental growth in NRST paid by Master's degree students to the central campus. For 2022-23, the increment to the central campus is an increase of approximately \$3.7 million. The central campus supports investment in graduate education including graduate student support allocated through GS, such as graduate fellowships, supplemental NRST fellowships for 2nd and 3rd year graduate students, TA fee remission, and investments in graduate education infrastructure and administrative support through this allocation and other core fund sources if needed.
